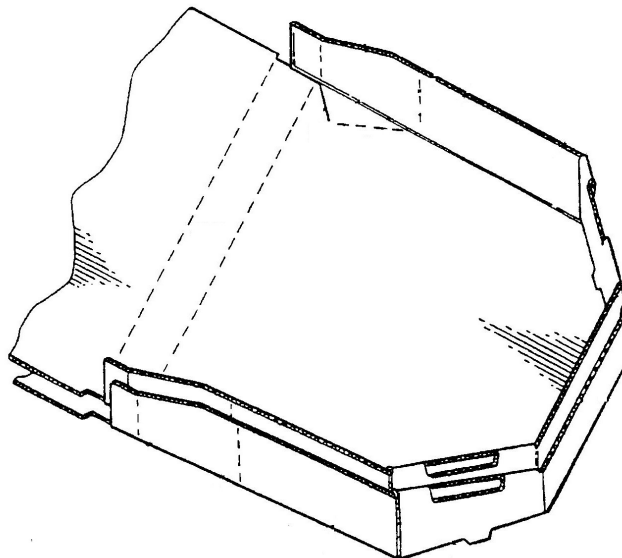


## ***How to Use the UltraSaver™ Box***

- 1) FOLDING IS EASY!** The UltraSaver™ Box looks complex. Which makes people wrongly assume that folding it must be complex, too. In fact, folding this box is *quick* and *easy*. Once a person learns how, it takes no more time than for folding the traditional square pizza box.
  
- 2) PARFOLDING AND STACKING:** Parfolding is recommended. To do this, create a stack of parfolded boxes in preparation for the upcoming rush (or for the next day), as shown below. There's no need to create stacks of fully-folded boxes as this wastes time and storage space. Use these two steps to easily create a parfolded box:
  - 1 – ERECT THE LEFT SIDE WALL, FRONT WALL, AND LEFT DIAGONAL WALL PANELS:** Here's how. Hold the left side wall in your left hand and the front wall in your right hand. Then *simultaneously* fold these two wall panels upright and, with your thumbs, roll the left diagonal wall panel up and over and lock it in place.
  
  - 2 – ERECT THE RIGHT SIDE WALL AND RIGHT DIAGONAL WALL PANELS:** Hold the right side wall in your right hand and the front wall in your left hand. Then fold the right side wall upright and, with your thumbs, roll the right diagonal wall panel up and over and lock it in place. You now have a parfolded UltraSaver™ Box. Nest boxes together to create a stack, as shown below.



- 3) PIZZA-CUTTING:** When a pizza comes from the oven, pull a box from the stack and place the pizza into it. Cut as usual.

**4) CLOSING:** To close the box:

- (a)** Simultaneously flip the two rear diagonal wall panels inward. This will cause the cover panel to rise slightly, making it easy to grab.
- (b)** Pull the cover panel forward while simultaneously folding the left and right cover side flaps inward (to a position inside of the box cavity).
- (c)** Simultaneously fold the left and right cover locking flaps downward and tuck them into the two receiving slots. That's it.

**TIP:** You will note that there's an *extra-high tab* along the front edge of each receiving slot. This enables you to instantaneously insert the cover locking flap into the slot without hassle or fumbling. To do this, simply position the cover locking flap behind the tab and, once there, push the cover down until both flaps slide into the slots.

NOTE: The first time you close the cover, the locking flaps may seem to resist sliding into the slots. No problem. Simply apply enough downward pressure to "force" the flap into the slot. The second time the cover is closed it will work easier. Also, when the cover is opened without a pizza in the box it may seem to require extra lifting force. However, after the box has carried a hot pizza (i.e., after the customer gets it home), the cover opens with a "normal" amount of force.
